Anxiety v. Peace

More than any other time in my life I hear people saying things like, "I can't relax. My mind is so restless, my body so tense; my shoulders hurt, my back is sore. I have trouble sleeping at night; and when I finally do get to sleep I eventually wake up shortly thereafter because my mind is racing all over the place." Does this sound familiar? I'm sure it does.

So why are people so restless these days? What's the problem? In a word, the problem is anxiety. Anxiety is in the air today and it is thick. Like a fire's smoke, anxiety billows up from the burning, anxietygenerating events around us. In many situations, throughout this far too often hostile world, there's an absence of peace. Watch the news, read the newspaper, or look to see what's trending within social media venues and you'll quickly see that this world has many issues. We've got lunatics strapping bombs to themselves in an effort to destroy life and then, claim their actions as an act of faith; we've got psychopaths leading governments that are more concerned with the development of weapons than they are at addressing the destitution of their people; we've got economic systems collapsing around us because of the cosmic levels of debt upon them; and on top of all this, we've got some very highly anxious people using highly anxious language, which is taking the already existing, natural level of anxiety to an even higher level. So yes, anxiety is definitely in the air. In fact, it has created an addictively potent atmosphere. Instead of staying below the fumes of anxiety, people seem to uprightly enjoy inhaling them. And unlike physical breathing, which involves one thing in and another thing out, when anxiety is inhaled it is always exhaled as well. Is it any wonder then that people are suffocating from the emissions of anxiety?

It's time to purify the air. It's time to stop our culture's fascination with negativity. It's time to silence the airwaves of their problem finding vernacular and start voicing, rather loudly, the one and only Solution to all the hostilities in the world. It's time to put anxiety, and fear, and paranoia in its proper place. In other words, it's time to preach Christ, the Prince of Peace, more boldly than ever. It's time to proclaim him as King of Kings and claim his peace in the midst of the most hostile and anxious of situations. It's time to breath in the peace of Christ and breath it out again. And it's past due time to trust in the power of the Holy Spirit to empower us to be ambassadors of God's peace in these highly anxious times.

Men's Friday Bible Study




Roundup of more news at Rose Hill UMC


